Australian Institute of Parapsychological Research

In 1977, the Australian Institute of Parapsychological Research, Incorporated (AIPR) was established in Sydney, New South Wales.^[1] The AIPR is Australia's oldest extant parapsychological research institute. The AIPR publishes a biannual (June/December) peer-reviewed journal, the *Australian Journal of Parapsychology*,^[2] with an accompanying newsletter, THE A.I.P.R. NEWS.^[5] The journal was first published in 2001.

The *Journal* publishes articles on extra-sensory perception (ESP), psychokinesis (PK), and life after death. Articles are generally accessible to the intelligent layperson. The *Journal* publishes papers on both experimental and theoretical topics.



As of 2016, just over half the articles across 16 volumes (32 issues) have come from Australian researchers (56%), with close to half being authored by overseas researchers (44%) who hail from countries such as the USA, UK, Canada, Germany, Denmark, Spain, Argentina, Brazil, and Portugal. Some articles (5%) are the result of collaborations between Australian and overseas researchers.

The majority of articles are from psychologists (approximately 80%), but contributions also come from psychiatrists, physicists, physicians, neuroscientists, philosophers, historians, and anthropologists.
